He has thirteen brothers and two sisters and among them he was second number. He completed his school life from Chand Lal Govt Primary School, class sixth to eighth from Government Secondary School at

Nainital. He completed his high school and senior secondary from C R S C Inter College, Nainital and graduation from J N P G college, Lucknow. He started playing hockey from Nainital from his school days. His family members were never against sports. But his dedication of hockey made worried to his father for his future career. Because of in those days our country was passing through political unbalance. Syed Ali was self motivated and did very hard practice daily by daily. As his mother said; he never loses his practice and looking hockey matches.

After some times Syed Ali attracted to late K. D. Singh Babu and N Jhaman Lal Sharma with art of hockey. He was very dedicated for hockey and came back Lucknow. He stepped in Lucknow hostel in 1971 as a student of hockey. Progress in any field is closely related to the availability of quality of professional leadership, dedication and disciplined life and to its leaders.

Syed Ali was a member of the Indian hockey team in the 1970s and early 80s. He played hockey on the field from 'left out' position. He started sports career under guidance of his 'Guru' Jhaman Lal Sharma coaching of late K. D. Singh Babu and N Jhaman Lal Sharma. He played many national and international tournaments for our country like: Gold medal in Renfrank International tournament at Australia and Newzeland tour in 1975, in1976 represented First Olympics at Montreal and awarded by the 'Baby of team'. He played as the youngest player of the team and also he was the first Olympian of K.D. Singh 'Babu' Memorial Society at Lucknow s well as Lucknow hostel. Laxman award by Uttar Pradesh state Government in 1975, Gold Medal in Pre-Olympics Game in 1979, in 1982 Silver Medal in Asian Games at Delhi, government of India awarded by Dhyanchand life time achievement award for his dedication, honesty, working capacity, and developing hockey on gross route level without any hesitation.

From 1987 he began work as chairman of K.D. Singh 'Babu' Memorial Society at Lucknow after Shri Jhaman Lal Sharma. And also involved in developing hockey in Lucknow and India as a whole. Presently he is working as a coach and technical secretary of K.D. Singh society Academy for under 19 and 14 age group both and boys. And every year he has organize the national tournament in India at Lucknow. He is the first Olympian and International hockey player of K.D. Singh 'Babu' stadium of Lucknow. His dedication towards the hockey shows his efforts to providing facilities and platform for Hockey to the rural and urban areas of Uttar Pradesh in India. He is working with Indian selection committee of Hockey for Men's and Women's from last eight years.


